*Languing in second language learning and teaching:
Theory and research*

The act of producing language in the form of speaking or writing in order to think through a problem (i.e., languaging) may help people clarify their thinking and transform their thoughts into objects for further reflection. Finally, I will consider implications for theory and research and then discuss for second language pedagogy.
